There had been financial mismanagement issues brought to light, and our Club's Board of Directors made a decision to withhold further contributions to Alabama Lions Sight, until changes were enacted to address its financial issues. The CEO, Lion Barry Elliott, and the COO, Lion Cody, were removed from their positions within Alabama Lions Sight. Nothing criminal has been indicated -- just mismanagement. All the financial records are being reviewed and a new auditing firm is being sought to go over all books, from A to Z.

Lion Craig also reported that due to contract issues with the wrong cartel, the Lions International Convention has been moved from Mexico City to Orlando, FL. "The Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind Band" has been invited to perform during the Convention.

Lion Don Smith reported that an editor at the Cullman Tribune newspaper was upset that he would not be allowed to be present during our review of financial results from the Cullman County Fair. Lion Don explained that our Club is a non-profit organization (501c3), not a charity (501c4). As such, it's meetings are not public. However, an IRS Form 990 is filed annually. That form provides financial details with balances and major distributions and is available for public scrutiny on the IRS website.
